





This practice is useful in the true sense who confirm the bond with students for overall progress.
- III) The Practice:
 - The practice is that of creating an efficient 'Guardian teacher' system. Each Teacher is assigned 15-20 students of B.A., B.Com and B.Sc I year for 3 years. They meet at least once of month to discuss clarity and primarily to share various problems which may be personal, domestics, academic etc. The Teacher is well equipped with all the necessary information about his/her ward a Bio-data is collected and filled. The college is located in ruler area. therefore all students are from villages. A visit is conducted to 50 to 60 villages for the awareness of higher education. Advises the parent to send their wards to attain regularly the classes.

- IV) Evidence of success:
 - Teacher's visit to the villages of college catchment area awareness of higher education increased attendance of students in class-room, increased participation in cocurricular, in creased participation in co- curricular activities better discipline on campus respective relationship between teacher and students are some outputs of this practice.
- V) Problem Encountered and Resources required:
 - This practice requires well-committed teaching staff who have the desire to help students beyond classroom and beyond teaching hours. There are number of constrains and limitations in our effort to attain excellence. Some major constrains/ Problems are indicated below.
 - 1) Communication with students difficult special who are not attending college.
 - 2) Mob-cell number of some students found changed. So communication is not possible with them.
 - 3) Require a visit to their villages beyond college hours.
 - 4) Major students are from farmer family so not willing to attend regular class.
